

- On September 28 & 29, 2023, approximately 4,000 8th-grade students will gather at the Peoria Civic Center to interact with local professionals. Students act out careers through hands-on activities to visualize their future and lay the foundation for high school studies, preparing them for a career path.
- In the spring, High School students explore local employers through an online interactive expo and gain valuable skills for landing the right job for them.
- Both experiences connect with the JA Inspire curriculum and resources showcasing our region's most critical industry clusters and employers, including manufacturing, healthcare, innovation and technology, business and finance, and more.
